PAST EVENTS:

Chile - This event brought together professionals from various industries around the world to discuss film recruitment, film incentives, sustainable filming, film tourism and the economic benefits of filming for businesses of all kinds.

Greece – 2 days of educational and outreach seminars during the 10th Aegean Film Festival on Spetses, including workshops involving local location managers, production managers and producers.

Croatia - The Guild has participated in the Zagreb Film Office's Pro Film Days industry symposium for the last 4 years presenting panels as well as in conjunction with the Croatian Audiovisual Center engage with local officials in information exchange meetings in other cities and regions within the country.



Egypt – Several of our members while attending the 45th Annual Cairo Film Festival presenting a panel on international location management as well as toured the Egyptian Media Production Centre and set groundwork for future endeavors.
